Total Award: \$100,000 over 14 months

To support Fifty Large/Natan/21/64, a philanthropic network of young Jews seeking to help transform the Jewish future by funding innovative solutions to crucial questions in Jewish life, as well as a framework for addressing the challenges of next generation and intergenerational philanthropy. In this third year of funding, the philanthropic network Natan will continue to support new initiatives in Jewish life aimed to meaningfully engage next generations of Jews, expand its membership of young philanthropists, educate funders, provide technical assistance to grantees, and develop a self-sufficient and sustainable structure for the organization. Grand Street (formerly "Baby Natan") will continue to convene next generation leaders in family philanthropy to discuss their roles and garner philanthropic tools. The project will furthermore offer resources and recruit a third cohort of young people involved in family foundations. 21/64 - the programmatic element working to address intergenerational funding - will distribute a quarterly newsletter for foundations, social change organizations, and non-profits that want to engage multiple generations in their endeavors and examine the changing forces of community, identity, meaning, and philanthropy. 21/64 will also serve as a consultant to family foundations, funding collaboratives, and federations to provide philanthropic tools that help next generation and inter-generational audiences explore questions about what they have inherited, who they are, and how they can effectively make change.
