*The Gift of the Past: Who Deserves the Fruits of the  
Knowledge of the "Knowledge Economy"*

To support the process of expert scrutiny and review - prior to publication - of a manuscript entitled, The Gift of the Past: Who Deserves the Fruits of the Knowledge of the "Knowledge Economy." For the past three years researchers associated with the National Center on Economic and Security Alternatives (NCESA) have been developing a report and book on the commonly inherited, systemic, knowledge-based sources of economic growth - and the implications for a more equitable distribution of income and wealth. Because the manuscript involves technological and philosophical issues that are both sophisticated and controversial, NCESA believes the manuscript must be subjected to intense expert scrutiny before publication. Based on the outcome of the review process, NCESA will follow up on any needed research suggested by the reviewers prior to the publication and communication stage.
